The Northwest Iowa Community College Foundation was started in 1983, and in the past we have included information about the Foundation in the College's Annual Report. Beginning this year, I am very excited to present the first annual NCC Foundation Annual Report! One of the biggest pieces of news is since 1983 the NCC Foundation has awarded over 1,100 scholarships totaling approximately \$1.25 million! 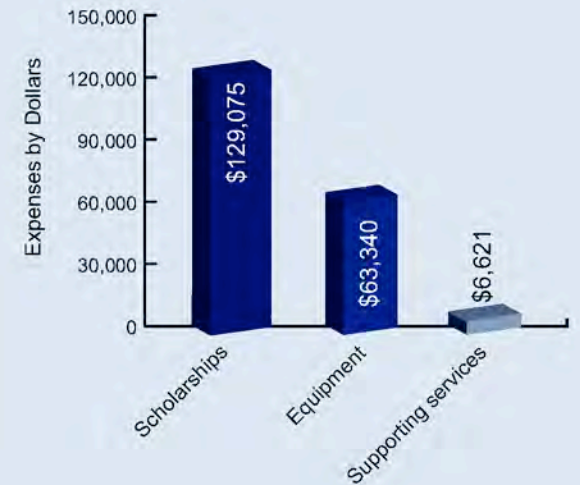
LIABILITIES & NET ASSETS
