
## Resource Materials

2004 may seem like that is a long way off, but we have to do some work before they get here. Several months prior to the NCA team visit we must write a comprehensive document called the Self Study.




The NCA Committee Structure has been established to write the NCA report that is due in the Fall of 2004.



Next semester data should be gathered, analyzed and used to write each section of the Selfstudy. This will be the long up-hill pull of this train ride.


Most of you have been attending multiple meetings of your writing

I know that all of you spent many hours this summer thinking about the NCA self-study and what you will need to do to improve the document—*NOT*!


Actually we hope that everyone had a good break from the routine and had some time to enjoy the summer.

There is some good news and some bad news about the new criteria. The bad news is that I went to a training session in Denver on the new criteria, and they are still pretty poorly defined and understood. The good news is that we are going to be among the few colleges that will be setting the standards for all future self-studies.

This week we are sending edited drafts back to the writing teams. The biggest thing we are asking for is more information. We need to work in the four cross-cutting themes.

Please take a look at the comments made and try to gather the new data as soon as you can. We are setting a deadline of October 6 for all rewrites. If you have any questions contact Steve, Alethea, Rhonda or Gretchen.

## **Assessment vs. Evaluation**

NCA has decided to make a change in the way they define two terms—assessment and evaluation.

For now, they will use the words this way:

**Assessment** will refer to measuring *student learning outcomes*.

**Evaluation** will refer to the way we assess the *effectiveness of all other college processes*.

## Four Cross-Cutting Themes

In addition to the five criterion, NCA wants to see a more holistic approach to writing the self-study. We will try to avoid too much redundancy, but they do want to see something on all four themes in each section.

If you see that you addressed one of these themes, you should highlight it and then make a note—we will work out redundancy and language issues as the editing committee. Just as a reminder, here are the new criterion that should incorporate in our writing.

Criterion 1—*Mission and Integrity*. The organization operates with integrity to ensure the fulfillment of its mission through structures and process that involve the board, administration, faculty, staff, and students.

Criterion 2—*Preparing for the Future*. The organization's allocation of resources and its processes for evaluation and planning demonstrate its capacity to

fulfill its mission, improve the quality of its education, and respond to future challenges and opportunities.

Criterion 3—Student Learning and Effective Teaching. The organization provides evidence of student learning and teaching effectiveness that demonstrates it is fulfilling its educational mission.

Criterion 4—Acquisition, Discovery, and Application of Knowledge. The organization promotes a life of learning for its faculty, administration, staff, and students by fostering and supporting inquiry, creativity, practice, and social responsibility in ways consistent with its mission.

Criterion 5—*Engagement and Service*. As called for by its mission, the organization identifies its constituencies and serves them in ways both value.
